

Help us track Beech Leaf Disease

Beech Leaf Disease has been found in the Tinker's Creek and Brandywine Creek watersheds,

and we need your help to track its spread.

The disease is readily apparent looking up into the canopy to see dark bands on the leaves. Leaves will also begin to thicken, curl, and turn black.

Restoration Projects

Owen Brown Street Stream Restoration

TCWP has been awarded a Section 319 with the Ohio and US EPA to restore >1,800 linear feet of stream in Hudson! The City of Hudson had provided generous match for this project.

This unnamed tributary is disconnected from its



floodplain and overrun with invasive vegetation. We have begun design and surveying for this project.

HUB District Riparian Enhancement

Warrensville Heights has been awarded a \$34,000+ Clean Ohio grant from the Ohio Public Works Commission with matching funds of \$11,000+ from the City. Funds will be used to enhance and permanently protect 5.6 acres of riparian habitat and wetlands along Bear Creek, a major tributary to Tinker's Creek. Northern Ohio Watershed (NOW) Corps





In collaboration with <u>Serve Ohio</u>, Ohio's Commission on Service and Volunteerism, we had the opportunity to celebrate AmeriCorps Week from March 7th to 13th.

Our 15 NOWCorps members have been busy serving the northern Ohio watersheds and communities through stewardship, conservation, and education since October. You can read more about them here. We asked some of our members to share with us how their service is going, and here's what they had to say.

"Hello! I'm **Emma** and I'm serving as a naturalist assistant at the Watershed Stewardship Center with Cleveland Metroparks through AmeriCorps. I love learning and teaching all about Ohio's local wildlife, working on conservation projects, and protecting the environment. I'm jazzed to continue hiking, growing, and serving my community through NOWCorps!"

"Hi, my name is **Tori** and I am currently serving with The Nature Conservancy. My service revolves around managing the lands that TNC is responsible for and collecting data for various projects happening in the region. I enjoy making a direct impact in the environment and people around me. I feel privileged with the ability to maintain these lands and make them more available for both recreationists and the

wildlife in the area. Thank you to both The Nature Conservancy and AmeriCorps for allowing me to make a difference (and have a lot of fun doing it)!"

"Hi! I'm **Evan** (they/them) currently serving with NOWCorps as a Natural Resources Technician with Cleveland Metroparks. I've been working on a variety of different stewardship actions including tree plantings, invasive plant treatment, deer management, prescribed fire, Hemlock surveys, and even some video editing at many of our parks throughout Cuyahoga county. I serve to learn from the Metroparks staff, and to take an active role in improving local ecosystems for the human and more-than-human communities!"

Nikole: "I'm proud to serve the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District as an educator with Native Urban Tree Starters program through AmeriCorps. The overlooking of plants and less attractive wild areas could lead to further ecosystem degradation and species loss. Therefore, reestablishing interest with nature through education has become central to my current goals. This Spring/Summer I hope to plant 3,000 native trees around Cuyahoga County."

Joe is serving with the Cleveland Metroparks Trail Crew to improve accessibility and sustainability of the trails within the reservations. His role in tandem with NOWCorps is to construct trail infrastructure that reduces the environmental impact of soil erosion to the Cuyahoga River watershed.

"My name is **Dana**, and I am proud to serve as a Restoration Team Member with The Nature Conservancy. I love spending each day outdoors where I can see the purpose of my work. Between surveying forests, treating invasive species and restoring habitats, I am excited to know that I make a difference with my service every day."

The group was led by Derrick Cooper of The Nature Conservancy, as well as Dana Barry and Tori Clawson, the NOWCorps members serving with TNC. The group learned how to identify eastern hemlock trees and the invasive pests that attack them: elongate hemlock scale and hemlock wooly adelgid. They also learned to perform forestry surveys, which are valuable if the trees need to be treated for infections later.

We look forward to seeing what else our members will continue to accomplish this year!
