Beech Leaf Disease has been found in the Tinker's Creek and Brandywine Creek watersheds, and we need your help to track its spread.

The disease is readily apparent looking up into the canopy to see dark bands on the leaves. Leaves will also begin to thicken, curl, and turn black.
