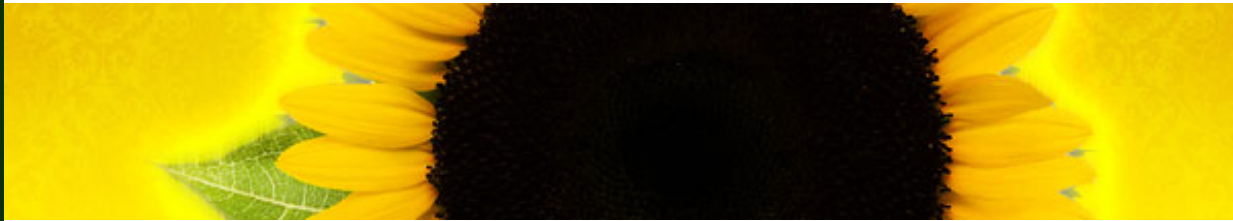

Restoration Projects



Owen Brown Street Stream Restoration

TCWP has been awarded a Section 319 grant with the Ohio and US EPA to restore >1,800 linear feet of stream in Hudson! The City of Hudson had provided a generous match for this project.

You'll start to see equipment out on-site this spring!

HUB District Riparian Enhancement

Warrensville Heights has been awarded a \$34,000+ Clean Ohio grant from the Ohio Public Works Commission with matching funds of \$11,000+ from the City. Funds will be used to enhance and permanently protect 5.6 acres of riparian habitat and wetlands along Bear Creek, a major tributary to Tinker's Creek.

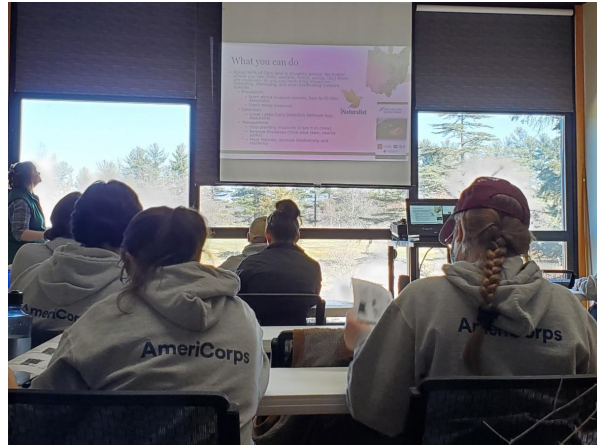
Happy (belated) AmeriCorps Week! (March 14 - 18th, 2022)

AmeriCorps engages 250,000 Americans each year in sustained, results-driven service through AmeriCorps and AmeriCorps Seniors programs. These dedicated citizens help communities manage COVID-19 response, ensure students stay on track to graduate, combat hunger and homelessness, respond to natural disasters, fight the opioid epidemic, help seniors live independently, support veterans and military families, and much more. More than 1.2 million Americans have served their country through AmeriCorps and millions more have served in AmeriCorps Seniors since 1994.

A growing body of [research](#) shows that service has an effect on more than just the communities served, but also on the members themselves. AmeriCorps alumni credit their

year of service for developing leadership skills that bridge divides, solve problems, and open doors to career and educational advancement.

As an agency, AmeriCorps has created initiatives to support AmeriCorps alumni, building on this research.
