Recycle Your Christmas Tree

Don't let your Christmas tree become a statistic. Each year approximately 10 million Christmas trees end up in landfills! Discarded Christmas trees can be repurposed into numerous things, including animal food and enrichment! Many cities offer programs to turn your tree into mulch

Take Care Not to Over Apply Salt

Although salt can be a helpful component of winter maintenance, it is important to note that it doesn't just disappear with the snow. Instead, salt has the potential to enter the water via stormwater where it negatively impacts the environment. This is why it is imperative not to over-salt when attempting to keep the sidewalks clear. A handful of salt per square yard is all that is needed to achieve maximum coverage.

Is Your Rain Barrel Ready for Winter?

Proper winterizing of rain barrels is essential to ensure they work properly and efficiently all year long! It's easy. Just follow the steps below!

- Drain Barrel
- Remove Hose and Diverter
- Clear Debris from Barrel
- Store in Garage or Cover with Tarp if no Indoor Space is Available

Recent Grant Award



We are thrilled to announce that we were awarded \$2,500 in funding from the Akron Community Foundation. We received discretionary funds of \$1,950 from the James G. Restoration Projects



Owen Brown Street Stream Restoration

TCWP has been awarded a Section 319 with the Ohio and US EPA to restore >1,800 linear feet of stream in Hudson! The City of Hudson had provided a generous match for this project.

The design on this project has been completed, and we are waiting for our approved permits.

HUB District Riparian Enhancement

Warrensville Heights has been awarded a \$34,000+ Clean Ohio grant from the Ohio Public Works Commission with matching funds of \$11,000+ from the City. Funds will be used to enhance and permanently protect 5.6 acres of riparian habitat and wetlands along Bear Creek, a major tributary to Tinker's Creek.
